# Ethics and Values

## Ethics: Some definitions

- A set of moral principles and values
- Standards that contain aspects of duty and obligation
- A discipline that deals with what is good and what is bad



# Professional Ethics

- Code of Conduct
  - Principles that form the foundation of the way individuals or organization ought to conduct themselves according to a common understanding of duty and obligations



# The Law and Ethics

- Is ethical behaviour always legal?
- Is legal behaviour always ethical?
- Does ethics in law go beyond compliance?



# Universal Principles of Ethics

- Trustworthiness
- Responsibility
- Respect
- Loyalty
- Compassion
- Fairness

# Principles

- **Trustworthiness**
  - Keeping front and centre your role in serving the community
  - Avoiding situations and actions that cause the public to question the integrity of City Council
- **Responsibility**
  - Being accountable for your own actions



# Principles

- **Respect**
  - Listening and respecting opinions of others
  - Focusing comments on an issue and not the person
  
- **Loyalty**
  - Supporting steadfastly the work and direction of City Council and the City of Vaughan

# Principles

- Compassion
  - Being conscious of the distress in others and a desire to assist in alleviating that distress
  - Caring about the needs of all individuals
- Fairness
  - Acting with impartiality and without bias

# Dilemmas

- Right v. Wrong - relatively easy
  - Not using public resources for personal gain
  - Treating others with respect
- Right v. Right - more difficult
  - Competing values
  - If your decision serves the public well, but ends up undermining City Council, what do you do?
